## INDOWIND POWER PRIVATE LIMITED Notes forming part of the financial statements

Note Particulars

#### 1 Significant accounting policies (Illustrative)

### 1.01 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

#### 1.02 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

#### 1.03 Inventories

Inventories are valued at cost after providing for obsolescence and other losses, where considered necessary. Work-in-progress and finished goods include appropriate proportion of overheads and, where applicable, excise duty.

#### 1.04 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances.

#### 1.05 Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation shall be provided on the straight-line method as per the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.

The estimated useful life of the intangible assets and the amortisation period are reviewed at the end of each financial year and the amortisation method is revised to reflect the changed pattern.

#### 1.06 Revenue recognition

#### Sale of goods

Sales are recognised, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers. Sales include excise duty but exclude sales tax and value added tax.

#### 1.07 Other income

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.

#### 1.08 Tangible lixed assets

Fixed assets, are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of fixed assets includes interest on barrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying fixed assets up to the date the asset is roady for its Intended use and other incidental expenses incurred up to that date. Machinery spares which can be used only in connection with an item of fixed asset and whose use is expected to be irregular are capitalised and depreciated over the useful file of the principal item of the relevant assets.

Fixed assels acquired and put to use for project purpose are capitalised and depreciation thereor is included in the project cost till commissioning of the project.

#### Capital work-in-progress;

Projects under which assets are not ready for their intended use and other capital wask-in-progress are carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable interest.

#### 1.09 Investments

Long-term investments (excluding investment properties), are carried individually at cost less provision for aminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value. Cost of investments include acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

Investment properties are carried individually at cost tess accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any, investment properties are capitalised and depreciated (where applicable) in accordance with the policy stated for Tanglible Fixed Assets, impairment of investment property is determined in accordance with the policy stated for impairment of Assets.

#### 1.10 Employee boneills

Employee benefits include provident lund, superannuction fund, gratuity fund, componsated obsences, long service awards and post-employment modical benefits.

#### 1.11 Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs include interest, amortisation of ancillary costs incurred and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost. Costs in connection with the borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to the acquisition of qualifying assets are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan.

#### 1,12 Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after lox (including the post lox effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted overage number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post lox effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income relating to the ciliutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted overage number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### 1.13 Taxes on Income

Current tox is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income (or the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) poid in accordance with the tax laws, which gives tuture economic benefits in the form of adjustment to future income tax liability, is considered as an assel if there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax. Accordingly, MAT is recognised as an assel in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the Company.

Deferred lax is recognised on liming differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originale in one period and are copable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all liming differences.

#### 1.14 impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each Balance Sheet date are reviewed for impoirment. If any Indication of impoirment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount.

#### 1.15 Provisions and conlingencies

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reflable estimate can be made. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes.

#### 1.16 Share Issues expanses

Share issue expenses and redemption premium are adjusted against the Securities Premium Account as permissible under Section 78(2) of the Companies Act, 1956, to the extent bolance is available for utilisation in the Securities Premium Account. The balance of share issue expenses is carried as an asset and is amortised over a period of 5 years from the date of the issue of shares.
